#### **Hampshire Clout Weekend 2015 Report by Dicky Summers**

The 3rd Hampshire Clout Weekend, incorporating the 9th Hampshire County Clout Championships, took place on the weekend of the 3rd & 4th October 2015, organised by Dicky & Roz Summers and hosted at Waterside Archers ground at Exbury.

The 2 day format again showed an excellent entry on both days with 66 on Saturday and 71 on Sunday.

Saturday was dry with sunny intervals with a variable breeze in the afternoon. 8 National Records were broken, 2 x 6 Clout End Awards, 1x 3 Clout End Awards (for Longbow), and 25 Tassels were claimed, including 2 purple tassels.

Sunday was overcast and breezy all day. 2 National Records were broken and 9 Tassels were claimed.

Results are now on the HAA website and have been distributed to the Archers.

Paperwork has been submitted for UK Records and Tassel Award claims.

Accounts were submitted in October - in summary we made £665.29 profit before trophy, medal, catering and host club costs are taken into account.

Last year we had non returnable trophies for both the Saturday open FITA round and for both County and Visitors for Sunday's Championship. This year medals only were supplied for Saturday with Trophies and medals for Sunday. For 2016, I would like to return to trophies for each day.

On a similar basis to this year, as Waterside Archers have indicated that they are prepared to host again, we are prepared to organise the Hampshire Clout Weekend to be on the 1st and 2nd October 2016.

**SCAS Representative**

Good evening everybody

The last meeting of the Southern Counties Archery Society was on Saturday 12th September 2015 at Grand Connaught Rooms in London.

My report will be as the minutes of the meeting, the only items I would draw to the counties attention would be as follows;

The chair asked us to go back to counties & ask what sort of speaker we should invite to speak at the SCAS AGM to encourage a better attendance.

I raised the subject of Bare Bow handicaps – this is not something that SCAS can help with but needs to go to the target committee at Archery GB. However both Surrey & Kent have the same issue & suggested a combined proposal to Archery GB. I can provide the email addresses of Bob Beaney of Kent & Les Bashford of Surrey if the county wants to proceed with this.

Ciaran Finn was to liaise with Mark Gowing regarding the further issue with Barebow handicaps.

#### **Child Protection Officer**

No report.

#### **County Coaching Organiser**

1. – Successful Level 1 training has increased coach numbers since November and future demand remains high. Numbers wanting to progress to Level 2 or County Coach seem to be static at present and we have lost 1 Senior and 2 County Coaches due to relocation.

Senior Coaches – 3	County Coaches – 10
Level 2 Coaches – 14	Level 1 Coaches – 70
2. – There are plans to continue the SCAS (Hants/W Sussex) Junior Training Centre run at South Downs College. The first of six sessions will commence in November and run through to April next year.
3. – Coaching workshops will be arranged to take place over the winter but our organiser is just recovering from having a pacemaker fitted.
4. – A Level 1 course completed successfully in June, a Level 2 course commenced in July, a Level 1 course (possibly a double) is planned to run from December and complete in April and a further Level 1 course is being planned for Spring 2016.
5. – An initiative to take open coaching sessions to different venues around the county this summer was poorly supported so a different scheme will be planned for next summer.
6. – I attended the CDC/CCO meeting at Milton Keynes 25th/26th Sept where the emphasis was on planning.
7. – HAA Coaching Group are now drawing up a 3 year Plan.
8. – Hampshire appears to be one of few Counties not to have appointed a Development Officer.

#### **5. Future Venue for Meetings**

The Secretary reported her visit to the venue at Alton Four Marks as to suitability for future meetings. She stated that the room was of a size suitable to hold the usual numbers attending Executive Meetings. There was also a bar available and parking. Concern was raised as to whether numbers attending meetings would drop and it was felt that only a trial would clarify this doubt. It was suggested that alternative venues between Alton Four Marks and Fleming Park for the 2016/17 Executive Meetings. Proposed by Matt Hicks, Seconded by David Strong. 14 members voted in favour, 8 members abstained. Decision to alternate venues was carried with a majority.

## 6. Silver Trophies

Carla and Julian Piper have photographed and catalogued all Hampshire trophies now retrieved. Some of these were no longer of usable quality and many had been lost or not returned by winners over the years. Carla would like to retain two of the better trophies to use as a display on the presentation table at Hampshire tournaments and Dicky Summers would like a perpetual trophy for the FITA Clout.

Carla would provide the Secretary with a copy of the catalogue and she would distribute this to all Club Secretaries, with a view to collating interest from any Clubs for any of the trophies. The issue of distribution would be added to the February Executive Meeting for decision by members present.

## 7. Manager and Future of Hampshire Team

Matt Hicks and Paul Jeram put their names forward as Team Manager for consideration at the next AGM. In the interim, it was suggested that they liaise together as acting Team Managers to address the issue of the most suitable way to select a team squad and the next home match with West Sussex. Waterside offered their May Bank Holiday weekend FITA for this match.

With regard to the team selection, Matt Hicks was asked to discuss with Paul Jeram various ways that the team squad could be selected and bring suggestions to the February Executive Meeting for consideration.

## 8. Development Co-ordinator

The question was – do we have one or not?. Hampshire appears to be one of only a few not to have appointed anyone for the post. The Chairman had looked into the requirements and felt that we should appoint such an Officer. Colin Stopher reported on a presentation he had attended covering this area. Development Co-ordinators are there to try to help and advise on funding schemes, problems with shooting grounds etc.

Kevin Cassidy would put together a job description, to be distributed to see if there were any volunteers for this post. Further discussion at February Executive Meeting.

## 9. Any Other Business

a) Carla Piper put forward a proposal to change the format of 2016 Outdoor and 2017 Indoor Hampshire Championships. Below are details of this proposal:-

- **I propose that the format for next year's outdoors in Sept 2016 changes to**

Ladies & Gents Recurve & Compound "County Champs" are taken on a points system over the 2 days. Qualifying round, H2H (Sat) and WA1440 (Sun) 1 point for a win, 2 for second etc. for each 3 elements. Lower score wins and ties are resolved from the Sunday score 10, x's

Ladies & Gents Barebow & Longbow, juniors all bow styles "County Champs" are taken from the Sunday WA1440 and metrics 1- V

Sunday will be shot 6 arrow in 4 mins all day, faces used as applicable to format & WA rules at the time

Add a new entry form for clubs to enter their teams

The reason for this is that;

1. The majority of the entries were for both days
2. To challenge those who want to improve
3. But keeping the other bow styles and juniors in the same format
4. Try to encourage more clubs & juniors to take part

- **I propose that the format for indoors in Feb 2017 changes to**

Ladies & Gents Recurve & Compound "County Champs" are taken on a points system over the 2 days. Qualifying round 18m, H2H (Sat) 1 point for a win, 2 for second etc for each 3 elements. Lower score wins and ties are resolved from the **Sunday** score 10's a **WA18m**

Juniors older 2 age groups (jun ladies & jun gents-Recurve & Compound) "County Champs" are taken from the **WA18m Sunday**

Ladies & Gents Barebow & Longbow, juniors younger 2 age groups (jun ladies & jun gents all bow styles) & juniors older 2 age groups (ladies & gents – longbow & barebow) "County Champs" are taken from the **Portsmouth Sunday**

### **Secondly**

**Have a new club team** – mixed 1 of each bowstyle rec/ comp/long/bare. Entered as a team prior to the competition day -rather than rec x 4/ comp x3 / bare x2 & long x2

Add a new entry form for clubs to enter their teams

The reason for this is that;

1. To encourage the entries for both days
2. To challenge those who want to improve
3. Try to encourage more clubs & juniors to take part

- **Should the prices change for both events?**

**Please accept this as formal notice of this proposal in accordance with the Constitution to be put forward at the AGM in March 2016.**

- b) Carla Piper asked why the coaching section has a separate fund/account and why the monies are not incorporated into the HAA main account.

Louise Belbin as Treasurer replied that the funds were part of the main HAA Account and were shown at the foot of the Annual Audited Accounts. A full set of the Coaching Audited Accounts and HAA main audited accounts were available for presentation annually at the AGM.

Colin Stopher as Coaching Organiser said that the reason for having a separate account and cheque book for coaching monies was that the coaching section were a group and that monies were coming in and going out at various times throughout the year. It was easier for them to have the control rather than having to trouble the Treasurer each time they needed to pay money in and draw cheques for payments out.

- c) Carla Piper asked for consent to purchase two Hampshire Archery Association feather flags and a presentation tablecloth. These could be used at all of the Hampshire Tournaments and the flags taken to team matches. It was agreed that these could be purchased with a spend limit of £400.
- d) Carla Piper proposed financial assistance to Judges for attendance at the National Conference at Lilleshall. This attendance was a requirement as part of the sign-off for their re-accreditation (currently every four years). The current cost is over £100 per person for the weekend. Carla proposed that HAA funded Hampshire Judges to attend this National Conference once in every four years. The other years would be self funded.

Members at the Executive Meeting felt that we should look after our Judges, as it is County who benefit . Without Judges, there could be no Tournaments. The proposal was received favourably.

- e) County has a shortage of Judges and the Secretary proposed a one off payment of e.g. £100 per person towards their expenses, to all new Judges within Hampshire, upon receipt of their final qualification as a Judge. This is hoped to encourage members to take up Candidate Judge, with a view to full qualification.

- f) Nick Loader asked if it would be possible to issue a Certificate for records to record holders. David Strong said that this had been tried before but had not been sustained due to lack of feedback. He would look into it again.
- g) Louise Belbin asked if the County wished to continue to offer for sale Hampshire Archery Association badges and that she currently only had 4 badges remaining from an initial purchase of 500. It was agreed that Peter Hunton would obtain current prices and look after the distribution of the badges if the County wished to purchase further supplies.
- h) Carla Piper offered the County's congratulations to Graham Potts on being appointed Chairman of Judges at 2016 Rio Olympic Games.
